Vallejo's Chamber of Commerce president visits Solano Land Trust properties

On a beautiful spring day in March, Anita Hawkes, President and CEO of the Vallejo Chamber of Commerce, took a break from her work and visited three of Solano Land Trust's properties: King Ranch, Vallejo-Swett Ranch and Lynch

Canyon. The air was cool and the sky was clear and the views of Vallejo and the surrounding Bay Area were spectacular.

"From atop King Ranch I was amazed to be above the raptors as they soared through the air," she said. "To see a coyote was frosting on the cake." She was also fascinated by the meadowlarks, the state bird of her home state of Montana.

Hawkes was joined by Solano Land Trust Executive Director Nicole Byrd, who acted as tour guide; Development Director Greg Peterson; and Harry Englebright, Solano Land Trust volunteer and member of the Tri-City and County Cooperative Planning Group. Hawkes and Byrd are looking for more ways the Vallejo Chamber and Solano Land Trust can educate Vallejo residents about these amazing natural areas in their own backyards. As a start, the Vallejo Chamber board of directors will hold a planning conference at Rush Ranch later this spring. Hawkes also wants to spend more time hiking at Lynch Canyon and has taken the challenge to do the [Lynch Canyon Community Hike](#) on June 5.
